Just outside of the wetlands we saw an Osprey (fly through the trees away from the riverside on the opposite side of the Animas River (beyond the southeastern boundary), and also heard a Woodpecker knocking in that vicinity as well. We also heard a Hawk and an Imped in the central Wetlands grove of Cottonwood trees (inside the boundary) but were not able to positively identify them. We noticed Raccoon prints by the topsoil mounds. Lastly, we observed a Steller's Jay and Black-billed Magpie on the Zink's main property.
